

What's the Problem

Wiltshire is a county dominated by agriculture; over 85% of the land in the county is dedicated to some form of farming. Consequently it forms the counties most important habitat.

Changes in agricultural practises mean that farmland bird numbers have almost halved since 1970. Farmland waders have declined significantly but are often overlooked.


